Interactive Presentation Sessions at ECTC

At ECTC, both podium and interactive presentations (IPs) are equally esteemed, securing publication in the ECTC proceedings and the potential for award nominations. With ECTC's transition from posters to Interactive Presentations the significance of IPs has been underscored in facilitating face-to-face communication and immediate feedback among colleagues interested in your work.

Guidelines for Effective Presentations

Attend the Speakers Breakfast on your presentation day, where a session co-chair or IP committee member provides last-minute information. To captivate participants, prioritize colorful and visually impactful presentations. Advice includes utilizing charts, graphs, images, and large fonts while avoiding lengthy paragraphs or overly detailed equations. Presentation Formats

Normally, posters should not exceed 3.75 feet (91 cm) high and 7 feet (213 cm) wide to fit onto a 4 feet (121 cm) tall by 8 feet (243 cm) wide poster board which is at the disposal of the author. The wide board provides for ample interaction space with the audience. Alternatively, prepare a presentation using 8.5-inch x 11-inch (DIN A4) paper sheets, totaling no more than 20 pages to fill the board. After the session, please remove your presentation and leave the pins for the next presenter, as presentations aren't collected.

Attendance Requirement and Impact

Unattended posters lead to the removal of associated papers from the ECTC proceedings and online publication (IEEE Xplore). **Sessions require authors' presence throughout.**The presenting author must be present during the whole duration of the session and answer any related question from ECTC attendees. The time slot for your session is designed to capture the attendees during the refreshment break in between podium presentation sessions.
